3.	(W) To reduce the number of commercial burglaries to 427 in 2004/05 representing a reduction of 17% on the 2001/02 number of 514
4.	(W) To reduce the overall number of business crimes to 3797 in 2004/05 representing a reduction of 8.5% on the 2001/02 number of 4160
