Suggested next steps (if not final decision please set out below)

1. **RECOMMENDATION**

- 1.1 Members are asked to consider an application for a street trading consent for the sale of jacket potatoes in Warwick Market Square.
- 1.2 Members are asked to modify the scheme of delegation regarding street trading consents.

2. REASONS FOR THE RECOMMENDATION

- 2.1 Anyone who exposes goods for sale within the District needs a street trading consent issued by the Council.
- 2.2 Mr Giles Massey, 1, Spencer Street, Learnington Spa has applied for a street trading consent in order that he may sell jacket potatoes. The consent, if granted would permit him to trade in all streets in the District. However, Mr Massey has requested on his application form to trade in Market Square, Warwick.
- 2.3 On receipt of the application, officers consulted with the Chief Officer of Police, the Highways Authority and the Council's Town Centre Managers.
- 2.4 The Highways Authority had no objection and the police did not respond. Adrian Field, Warwick Town Centre Manager made a representation against the granting of the consent for Warwick Market Place. (Appendix 1)
- 2.5 Mr Massey has had a meeting with Adrian Field to discuss the matter. Adrian Field is still against the granting of the consent (Appendix 2)
- 2.6 Mr Massey has responded by letter (Appendix 3)
- 2.7 Adrian Field and Mr Massey have been invited to attend the meeting.

2.7 Decision required.

The Committee are requested to either reject or accept the application from Mr Massey for a street trading consent to sell jacket potatoes in Warwick Market Square.

2.8 Decision required.

Should the Committee decide not to allow the grant of the consent, officers suggest that a condition is added to all consents issued prohibiting the use of Market Square Warwick at any time. The Council is empowered to add conditions under the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982.

2.9 Decision required.

At present, officers may grant a street trading consent, but have no powers in the scheme of delegation to reject one. Officers recommend a change to the scheme of delegation to allow the spokespersons to be consulted in the event of

representations being received against a street trading consent application. If, after a period of 5 days, the Spokespersons did not reply to the contrary, the consent would be granted. If one or more responded that they were not in favour of the application, the matter would be put before the entire Committee.
