Dear Licensing,

<u>Environmental Health Objection to TEMPORARY EVENT NOTICE in respect of Fizzy Moon for 21st</u> and 22nd August 2020, Your reference 037396

In response to your consultation of Environmental Health with regard to potential for nuisance.

Environmental Health object on the grounds that the proposed opening of the outside seating area until midnight is likely to give rise to noise nuisance to local residents arising from :

Sound of customers on the terrace,

Open doors between the inside bar and terrace allowing customer noise to escape from inside the building

Noise of music escaping from the building through open doors to the terrace.

We note that the existing premises licence WDC PREM 00201 ,contains a condition that "The use of external areas not be permitted and be vacated by 23.00". This was imposed after a hearing by the licensing panel. We are concerned that the stated purpose of this Temporary event Notice is to avoid that existing condition in the interests of maximizing occupancy of the pub rather than to allow an additional activity not covered by the existing licence. This is contrary to the Licensing Objectives.

The unintended? consequence of allowing the terrace to be open to midnight would be to undermine two other existing conditions of the existing premises licence namely "all doors and windows to be closed after 23.00" and "all open vessels to be removed from external areas to within the building by 11pm". The former is clearly intended to contain noise inside. The purpose of the later is to encourage people with unfinished drinks to move inside rather than consume them on the street.

We are aware of further 5 identical Temporary Event Notices having been submitted by the applicant for further5 successive weekends .Reference Numbers 037397, 037398, 037399, 037400, 037401

We hereby make the same objection to those and would ask if the six TENS could be disposed of by a single hearing before the Licensing Panel rather than six separate hearings. Not only is this more efficient but it allows the panel to consider the likely cumulative effects of six successive weekends on the amenity of local residents.

We assume that the LATE TEN on 14 / 15 August ,subject of our previous objection to Licensing will not now run. Being a LATE TEN it is not subject to a hearing.
