## 1. **Summary**

- 1.1 Warwick District Council, as the Licensing Authority, has received six valid Temporary Event Notice (TEN) applications for Mr Moe Kandola, Fizzy Moon, 35 Regent Street, Leamington Spa, CV32 5EE.
- 1.2 Representations have been received in relation to these Temporary Event Notice applications for the consideration of the panel in the determination of the applications.

## 2. Options Available to the Panel

2.1 Members are asked to consider the information contained in this report and decide whether the applications for Mr Moe Kandola, Fizzy Moon, 35 Regent Street, Leamington Spa, Warwickshire, CV32 5EE should be granted and, if so, whether the Temporary Event Notice's should be subject to any additional conditions.

The following options are available to Members:

**Option 1 -** Grant the TEN's as requested;

**Option 2 -** Grant the TEN's with amended hours and/or added conditions, or;

Option 3 - Refuse the TEN's.

#### 3. **Details for Consideration**

- 3.1 When considering the application's the panel must also give appropriate weight to:
  - a) The representations received.
  - b) Statutory guidance issued by the Secretary of State under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003.
  - c) The Council's Licensing Policy Statement (attached as appendix 3)
  - d) The Licensing Objectives, which are:
    - i) The Prevention of Crime and Disorder.
    - ii) Public Safety.
    - iii) The Prevention of Public Nuisance.
    - iv) The Protection of Children from Harm.

However, it must only consider those licensing objectives which have been referred to in the representations received.

- 3.2 The Council's Licensing Policy Statement provides that the authority will take an objective view on all applications and will seek to attach appropriate and proportionate conditions to licences where necessary in order to ensure the promotion of the four licensing objectives. Each application will be judged on its own merits.
- 3.3 Details of the procedure adopted by the Licensing Committee for Panel Hearings have been supplied to the applicant and those making representations. The procedure will be explained more fully by one of the Council's Legal Team at the commencement of the hearing.
- 3.4 Mr Moe Kandola applied for six Temporary Event Notice's for Fizzy Moon, 35 Regent Street, Leamington Spa, CV32 5EE, Warwickshire on 3<sup>rd</sup> August 2020.
- 3.5 The temporary event notice's were submitted to enable the use of the outside terraced area for Fizzy Moon for an additional hour between 23:00 to 24:00 on the dates below;
  - Friday 21st August 2020
  - Friday 28<sup>th</sup> and Saturday 29<sup>th</sup> August 2020
  - Friday 4<sup>th</sup> and Saturday 5<sup>th</sup> September 2020
  - Friday 11<sup>th</sup> and Saturday 12<sup>th</sup> September 2020
  - Friday 18<sup>th</sup> and Saturday 19<sup>th</sup> September 2020
  - Friday 25<sup>th</sup> and Saturday 26<sup>th</sup> September 2020

The premises currently has a premises licence (WDCPREM00201) that enables them to use the outside area until 23:00. A copy of the current premises licence and conditions is attached as appendix 1.

3.6 The Licensing Department have received objections from the following responsible authorities:

### Environmental Health

This objection is attached as appendix 2.

- 3.7 In accordance with section 105 of the Licensing Act 2003, the licensing authority must hold a hearing to consider the objection notice unless Environmental Health, the premises user and Licensing Authority agree that a hearing is unnecessary. The hearing must be concluded, and notice of the decision given to the premises user and the Police, no later than 24 hours before the temporary event is due to commence.
- 3.8 The panel can only consider those licensing objectives detailed in the objection received from Environmental Health.
