1. SUMMARY

1.1 The purpose of this report is to advise members of the exercise of delegated powers under CE(4) of the Scheme of Delegation to enable a letter of support to be submitted from this Council for a proposed University Technical College (UTC) at Stoneleigh Park.

2. **RECOMMENDATION**

2.1 That Executive note the use of delegated power CE(4) for the purposes of submitting the letter of support attached at Appendix One.

3. REASONS FOR THE RECOMMENDATION

- 3.1 The Scheme of Delegation, contained within the Council's Constitution provides for the Chief Executive (and in their absence the Deputies) to have authority to: 'deal with urgent items that occur between meetings, in consultation with the relevant Deputy Chief Executives, Heads of Service (if available) and Group Leaders (or in their absence Deputy Group Leaders) subject to the matter being reported to the Executive at its next meeting'. [CE(4)]
- 3.2 In the absence of the Chief Executive, the Deputy Chief Executive (BH) used this delegated power to seek approval for a letter of support for a bid proposal for a UTC at Stoneleigh Park, attached at **Appendix One**.
- 3.3 The letter of support was submitted on 27 May 2011 but reporting timetables have meant this is the first Executive to which a report could be submitted.

4. **POLICY FRAMEWORK**

- 4.1 The use of delegated powers is as set out in the Council's Constitution, as is this retrospective reporting.
- 4.2 The provision of a letter of support is consistent with the delivery of this Council's Vision for Warwick District to be a great place to live, work and visit as the principles of the UTC bid support the Council's Sustainable Community Strategy strategic priority of working with partner's on the Economy, Skills and Employment agenda to create an economically vibrant and creative community.

5. **BUDGETARY FRAMEWORK**

5.1 There are no budgetary implications arising from this report.

6. ALTERNATIVE OPTION(S) CONSIDERED

6.1 The alternative option would have been not to provide a letter of support but this was discounted on the basis that it would not further the Council's Sustainable Community Strategy's aims.

7. BACKGROUND

7.1 UTCs are colleges for 14-19 year olds, specialising in technical studies. Each UTC will be sponsored by a university and offer full time courses which combine academic and practical studies. They are being established under the Coalition Government's academies programme, from which they will receive funding after bid proposals are approved by the Department for Education. Further

- 7.2 The Stoneleigh Park bid is jointly sponsored by Coventry University and Warwickshire College and would specialise in science and technologies in relation to land based industries in their widest sense.
- 7.3 The development of a UTC at Stoneleigh Park would be consistent with the vision of its owners, LaSalle Investment Management, to establish the site as the primary national location for rural and agricultural organisations.
- 7.4 Were the bid to be successful the development of a UTC at Stoneleigh Park would be subject to the submission of a planning application, as normal.
- 7.5 It is hoped that the outcome of the bid will be known prior to the Executive meeting and, if so, an update will be provided to members as appropriate.
