110. MINUTES

The minutes of the meeting held on 4 September 2013 were agreed and signed by the Chairman as a correct record.

111. W13/1164 - 471A TACHBROOK ROAD, WHITNASH

The Committee considered an application from Mr Matthews for the demolition of the existing coach house, adjacent garage and erection of a new dwelling.

The application was presented to the Committee because of the number of objections received, including one from Whitnash Town Council.

It was the officer's opinion that the erection of a replacement dwelling on this site would be acceptable in principle. The proposed dwelling would not cause unacceptable harm to the living conditions of neighbouring dwellings or the character and appearance of the area. The proposals were also considered to be acceptable in terms of car parking and highway safety and it was therefore recommended that planning permission be granted.

The following people addressed the Committee:

Mr Ross in objection, Mr Matthews the applicant and Councillor Kirton who was speaking in objection and in his capacity as Ward Councillor.

It was proposed and duly seconded that permission be refused, contrary to the officers recommendations. The reasons for refusal were that the scheme was contrary to policies DP1 and DP2, was unneighbourly, overdevelopment, had an excess of blank walls and was a contrived application.

This proposal was lost 4 votes to 6.

Following consideration of the report and presentation, along with the representations made at the meeting, the Committee resolved that permission be granted in accordance with the officers recommendation.

 ${\color{red} {\bf RESOLVED}}$ that W13/1164 be GRANTED subject to the following conditions:

- the development hereby permitted shall begin not later than three years from the date of this permission. **REASON:** To comply with Section 91 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (as amended);
- (2) the development hereby permitted shall be carried out strictly in accordance with the details shown on the site location plan and

- approved drawing(s) 2542-100A & 2542-101B, and specification contained therein, submitted on 16 August 2013. **REASON**: For the avoidance of doubt and to secure a satisfactory form of development in accordance with Policies DP1 and DP2 of the Warwick District Local Plan 1996-2011;
- (3) the development hereby permitted shall only be undertaken in strict accordance with details of both hard and soft landscaping works which have been submitted to and approved in writing by the local planning authority. Details of hard landscaping works shall include boundary treatment, including full details of the proposed boundary walls, railings and gates to be erected, specifying the colour of the railings and gates; footpaths; and hard surfacing which shall be made of porous materials or provision shall be made to direct run-off water from the hard surface to a permeable or porous area. The hard landscaping works shall be completed in full accordance with the approved details within three months of the first occupation of the dwelling hereby permitted; and all planting shall be carried out in accordance with the approved details in the first planting and seeding seasons following the first occupation. Any tree(s) or shrub(s) which within a period of five years from the completion of the development dies, is removed or becomes in the opinion of the local planning authority seriously damaged, defective or diseased shall be replaced in the next planting season with another of similar size and species, unless the local planning authority gives written consent to any variation. All hedging, tree(s) and shrub(s) shall be planted in accordance with British Standard BS4043 - Transplanting Rootballed Trees and BS4428 - Code of Practice for General Landscape Operations. **REASON:** To ensure a satisfactory standard of appearance of the development in the interests of the visual amenities of the area in accordance with Policies DP1, DP2 and DP3 of the Warwick District Local Plan 1996-2011;
- (4) the development shall be carried out only in full accordance with sample details of the facing and roofing materials which shall have been submitted to and approved in writing by the local planning authority. **REASON:** To ensure that the proposed development has a

- satisfactory external appearance in the interests of the visual amenities of the locality in accordance with Policy DP1 of the Warwick District Local Plan 1996-2011;
- (5) the development hereby permitted shall be carried out in strict accordance with details of surface and foul water drainage works that shall have been submitted to and approved in writing by the local planning authority. **REASON:** To ensure that adequate drainage facilities are available for the satisfactory and proper development of the site in accordance with Policy DP11 of the Warwick District Local Plan 1996-2011;
- (6) detailed drawings shall be submitted to and approved by the Local Planning Authority before any work is commenced to indicate the finished site and ground floor levels intended at the completion of the development in relation to the existing site levels and the levels of the adjoining land and the development shall be carried out and completed in accordance with the details so approved. **REASON**: To protect the character of the area and the amenities of adjoining occupiers in accordance with the requirements of Policies DP1 and DP2 of the Warwick District Local Plan 1996-2011;
- (7) the dwelling hereby permitted shall not be occupied unless and until the car parking and manoeuvring areas indicated on the approved drawings have been provided and thereafter those areas shall be kept marked out and available for such use at all times unless otherwise agreed in writing by the local planning authority. **REASON:** To ensure that a satisfactory provision of off-street car parking and turning facilities are maintained at all times in the interests of the free flow of traffic and highway safety in accordance with Policies DP6 & DP8 of the Warwick District Local Plan 1996-2011;
- (8) the development hereby permitted shall not be first occupied unless and until the renewable energy scheme submitted as part of the application has been wholly implemented in strict accordance with the approved details. The works within this scheme shall be retained at all times thereafter and shall be maintained strictly in accordance with manufacturers

specifications. Microgeneration equipment no longer needed for microgeneration shall be removed as soon as reasonably practicable. **REASON**: To ensure that adequate provision is made for the generation of energy from renewable energy resources in accordance with the provisions of Policy DP13 in the Warwick District Local Plan 1996-2011;

- (9) prior to the occupation of the development hereby permitted, the following windows shall be permanently glazed with obscured glass to a degree sufficient to conceal or hide the features of all physical objects from view:
 - (a) the first floor window in the north elevation; and
 - (b) the first floor ensuite window in the south elevation.

The obscured glazed windows shall be retained and maintained in that condition at all times.

REASON: To protect the privacy of users and occupiers of nearby properties and to satisfy the requirements of Policy DP2 of the Warwick District Local Plan 1996-2011;

- (10) notwithstanding the provisions of the Town and Country Planning (General Permitted Development) Order 1995 (or any order revoking and re-enacting that Order with or without modification), no further development shall take place within the curtilage of any dwellinghouse hereby permitted which comes within Part 1, Classes A, B & E of Schedule 2 of this Order, without the prior written approval of the local planning authority. **REASON:** That due to the restricted nature of the application site and its relationship with adjoining properties it is considered important to ensure that no additional development is carried out without the permission of the local planning authority in accordance with Policies DP1 & DP2 of the Warwick District Local Plan 1996-2011;
- (11) the development hereby permitted shall be undertaken in the presence of a qualified bat worker appointed by the applicant to supervise all destructive works to the roofs of the buildings. All roofing material is to be removed carefully by hand. Appropriate precautions must be taken in case bats are found, such as

the erection of at least one bat box on a suitable tree or building. Should evidence of bats be found during this operation, then work must cease immediately while Natural England and WCC Ecological Services are consulted for further advice. Any subsequent recommendations or remedial works shall be implemented within the timescales agreed between the bat worker and the Local Authority Ecologist/Natural England. Notwithstanding any requirement for remedial work or otherwise, a report from the qualified bat worker detailing their findings shall be submitted to the local planning authority within 1 month following completion of the supervised works. **REASON**: To ensure that protected species are not harmed by the development; and

(12) noise arising from any plant or equipment at these premises, when measured one metre from the façade of any noise sensitive premises, shall not exceed the background noise level by more than 3dB(A) (measured as LAeq(5 minutes)). If the noise in question involves sounds containing a distinguishable, discrete, continuous tone (whine, screech, hiss, hum etc) or if there are discrete impulses (bangs, clicks, clatters, thumps etc) or if the noise is irregular enough to attract attention, 5dB(A) shall be added to the measured level. **REASON:** To protect the amenities of the occupiers of nearby properties in the locality in accordance with Policies DP2 & DP9 of the Warwick District Local Plan 1996-2011.

112. W13/1207 - WOODSIDE FARM, HARBURY LANE, BISHOPS TACHBROOK

The Committee considered an outline major application from Thomas Bates & Son Ltd for an urban extension comprising up to 280 new homes, public open space, landscaping, new access and highways and associated and ancillary development.

The application was presented to the Committee because of the number of objections received, including objections from Bishop's Tachbrook Parish Councils and the level of public interest in the application.

An addendum circulated at the meeting detailed two further objections and advised that Severn Trent Water had raised no objection subject to a drainage plan condition. In addition, condition 17 (archaeology) had been updated to include a caveat regarding any significant archaeological findings.

Another two objections, which had also been copied to Members prior to the meeting, commented on the planning and consultation process, incorrect housing supply numbers, local need and affordable housing. The addendum also detailed Chris White MP's support for local people's views.

It was the officer's opinion that due to the Council's lack of a five year housing supply, only limited weight could be afforded to Policy RAP1, therefore the NPPF required applications to be considered in the context of the presumption in favour of sustainable development. The development would deliver economic benefits through the generation of employment during the construction phase, and from the increased population which

would contribute towards increased expenditure in the local area and dependence on local facilities. Environmental benefits would arise from measures to increase biodiversity, sustainable transport improvements, more efficient use of land, provision of open spaces, sustainable drainage measures and new footpath/cycle way links. Officers had concluded that the development represented sustainable development because it was located adjacent to the urban area and would be integrated into the existing settlement by sustainable transport links

It was also concluded that the issues raised by objectors could be satisfactorily addressed through the assessment of reserved matters applications, the provision of new facilities, and the provision of new infrastructure by way of financial contributions. It was not considered that the impacts on the landscape and rural area, and heritage assets significantly and demonstrably outweighed the benefits of the development. The development was considered to comply with all current Local Plan policies aside from RAP1 and the fact that the site had been identified as a preferred option in the Revised Development Strategy needed to be given serious consideration.

Officers felt that the development remained acceptable in principle and all previous refusal reasons had been successfully overcome. It was therefore concluded that the development should be granted.

The following people addressed the Committee:

Councillor Deeley, Chairman of Bishops Tachbrook Parish Council, in objection, Mr Wood and Mr Mackay in objection and Councillor Kirton, objecting in his capacity as Ward Councillor.

Prior to the Committee's debate, the Council's legal advisor offered some advice regarding the five year housing supply issue. He advised that paragraph 49 of the NPPF stated that Housing applications should be considered in the context of the presumption in favour of sustainable development. It also stated that relevant policies for the supply of housing should not be considered up-to-date if the local planning authority could not demonstrate a five-year supply of deliverable housing sites.

He explained that the view of the Council's officers as set out in the report was that the Council could not demonstrate a five year supply of housing. If this was the case, then the Council's existing local plan policies, in respect of the supply of housing, should be considered out of date.

He concluded that in accordance with the NPPF, the application should therefore be granted unless any adverse impacts of doing so would significantly and demonstrably outweigh the benefits, when assessed against the policies of the NPPF. It was this test that members should bear in mind when making their decision and giving their reasons, rather than the housing policies in the existing local plan.

The Chairman directed Members to the minutes of the Planning Committee held on 13 August 2013, when this application had been previously considered. In the report before them, it was stated that 'the application was not refused in terms of principle' however, Members agreed that the

principle had never been debated. The Chairman therefore asked for this comment to be struck from the report.

It was proposed and duly seconded that the application be refused on the grounds that it was contrary to policy DAP2, Protecting the Areas of Restraint.

The Legal Officer gave some advice at this stage and reminded Members that policy DAP2 was a policy relevant to the supply of housing and, due to the Council's lack of a five year housing supply and in accordance with paragraph 49 of the NPPF, should be considered out of date. He advised that the test in paragraph 14 of the NPPF should be applied when determining the application.

A vote was taken on the proposal to refuse and was tied 5 votes to 5. The Chairman did not use his casting vote and the proposition fell.

It was, therefore, proposed and duly seconded that outline permission be granted, as long as the provision for on-site green space was included as an obligation in the Section 106 agreement.

RESOLVED that outline permission for W13/1207 be GRANTED subject to:

- (1) the conditions listed below,
- (2) the provision for on-site green space being included in as an obligation in the Section 106 agreement;
- (3) the Section 106 agreement being completed by 21 November 2013.

If the Section 106 agreement has not been completed by the 21 November 2013 the application may be refused.

- (1) details of the means of access to the building(s) and site, appearance of the building(s), landscaping of the site, layout of the site and its relationship with adjoining development, and the scale of building(s) (hereinafter called 'the reserved matters') shall be submitted to and approved in writing by the local planning authority before any development begins and the development shall be carried out in full accordance with these reserved matters as approved. **REASON:** To comply with Article 3(1) of the Town and Country Planning (General Development Procedure) Order 1995 (as amended);
- (2) application for approval of the reserved matters shall be made to the local planning authority not later than three years of the date of this permission. **REASON:** To comply with

- Section 92 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (as amended);
- (3) the development to which this permission relates shall begin within three years of the date of permission or within two years of the final approval of the reserved matters, whichever is the later. **REASON:** To comply with Section 92 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (as amended);
- (4) the access arrangement hereby permitted shall be carried out strictly in accordance with the details shown on the site location plan and approved access drawing(s) TCP12/191/11/B003/005A, TCP12/191/11/B003/006A, and specification contained therein, submitted on 22nd August 2013. **REASON**: For the avoidance of doubt and to secure a satisfactory form of development in accordance with Policies DP1 and DP2 of the Warwick District Local Plan 1996-2011;
- (5) an application for the approval of a construction phasing plan of the development shall be submitted before the expiry of three years from the date of this permission. The development shall hereafter be carried out in accordance with the phases established in the phasing plan as approved by the local planning authority. **REASON**: To ensure the proper phasing of the development;
- (6) no development shall take place under any relevant phase of development until a detailed lighting scheme for that phase has been submitted to and agreed in writing by the local planning authority. In discharging this condition the local planning authority expects lighting to be restricted around the boundary edges, particularly along hedgerows, where protected species are likely to be found, and to be kept to a minimum at night across the whole site in order to minimise impact on emerging and foraging bats and other nocturnal wildlife. This could be achieved in the following ways:
 - a. low pressure sodium lamps should be used in preference to high pressure sodium or mercury lamps
 - b. the brightness of lights should be as low as legally possible
 - c. lighting should be timed to provide some

dark periods

d. connections to areas important for foraging should contain unlit stretches
Such works, and use of that lighting and/or illumination, shall be carried out and operated only in full accordance with those approved details.

REASON: To ensure that any lighting is designed so as not to detrimentally affect the amenities of the occupiers of nearby properties and that appropriate measures are taken in relation to protected species in accordance with Policies DP2, DP3, DP9 and DAP3 of the Warwick District Local Plan 1996-2011;

- (7) no phase of the development shall take place under any reserved matters consent until a scheme for that reserved matters consent and phase of development showing how 10% of the predicted energy requirement of this development will be produced on or near to the site, from renewable energy resources, has been submitted to and approved in writing by the local planning authority. That phase of development shall not be first occupied until all the works within this scheme have been completed and thereafter the works shall be retained at all times and shall be maintained strictly in accordance with manufacturers specifications. Microgeneration equipment no longer needed for microgeneration shall be removed as soon as reasonably practicable. **REASON**: To ensure that adequate provision is made for the generation of energy from renewable energy resources in accordance with the provisions of Policy DP13 in the Warwick District Local Plan 1996-2011;
- (8) no development shall take place under any reserved matters consent until a scheme for that reserved matters consent has been submitted to and approved in writing by the local planning authority indicating how and when the 'Secured by Design' standards will be incorporated into the development. The scheme shall be implemented in accordance with the approved details and shall be retained thereafter. **REASON**: To ensure Secured by Design standards are met, in accordance with Policy DP14 of the Warwick District Local Plan;
- (9) no development shall take place under any reserved matters consent until a scheme for that reserved matters consent has been

submitted to and approved in writing by the local planning authority indicating how and when mixed open space facilities will be incorporated into the development, to include informal open space, appropriate children's play facilities, outdoor sport facilities and allotment gardens. The scheme shall be implemented in accordance with the approved details and shall be retained thereafter.

REASON: To ensure appropriate open space and recreational facilities are provided to serve the development in accordance with Policy SC13 of the Warwick District Local Plan 1996-2011;

- (10) no part of the development hereby permitted shall be commenced and nor shall any equipment, machinery or materials be brought onto the site until a scheme for the protection of all existing trees and hedges to be retained on site has been submitted to and approved in writing by the local planning authority and has been put in place. The scheme must include details of the erection of stout protective fencing and be in accordance with British Standard BS5837: 2012, a Guide for Trees in relation to construction. Nothing shall be stored or placed in those areas fenced in accordance with this condition and nor shall the grounds levels be altered or any excavation take place without the prior consent in writing of the local planning authority. The approved scheme shall be kept in place until all parts of the development have been completed and all equipment, machinery and surplus materials have been removed. REASON: In order to protect and preserve existing trees within the site which are of amenity value in accordance with Policy DP3 of the Warwick District Local Plan 1996-2011;
- (11) the development hereby permitted (including demolition) shall not commence until a Construction and Environmental Management Plan has been submitted to and approved in writing by the local planning authority. In discharging this condition the LPA expect to see details concerning pre-commencement checks for protected and notable species with subsequent mitigation as deemed appropriate. In addition appropriate working practices and safeguards for other wildlife dependent of further survey work, that are to be employed whilst works are taking place on site. The

- agreed Construction and Environmental Management Plan shall thereafter be implemented in full. **REASON**: To ensure that protected species are not harmed by the development in accordance with National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF), ODPM Circular 06/2005 and Saved Policy DAP 3 of the Warwick District Local Plan;
- (12) the development hereby permitted shall not commence until a detailed Landscape and Ecological Management Plan has been submitted to and approved in writing by the local planning authority. The plan should include details of planting and maintenance of all new planting. Details of species used and sourcing of plants should be included. The plan should also include details of habitat enhancement/creation measures and management, such as water bodies, native species planting, wildflower grasslands; provision of habitat for protected species. Such approved measures shall thereafter be implemented in full. **REASON**: To ensure a net biodiversity gain in accordance with NPPF;
- (13) the development hereby permitted shall not commence until a scheme detailing arrangements to protect residents of the development from excessive traffic noise entering habitable rooms and the provision of quiet garden areas shielded from road noise shall be submitted to and approved in writing by the local planning authority. The scheme shall be implemented in accordance with the approved details and shall be retained thereafter. **REASON:** To protect residents of the development from the adverse effects of traffic noise from outside the development in accordance with Policies DP2 & DP9 of the Warwick District Local Plan 1996-2011;
- (14) the development hereby permitted shall not be commenced until a scheme for the provision of adequate water supplies and fire hydrants, necessary for fire fighting purposes at the site, has been submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority. The development shall not then be occupied until the scheme has been implemented to the satisfaction of the Local Planning Authority. **REASON:** In the interests of fire safety;

(15) the development hereby permitted shall not

commence until: -

- 1(a) A site investigation has been designed for the site using the information obtained from the desk-top study and any diagrammatical representations (conceptual model). This should be submitted to and approved in writing by the local planning authority prior to that investigation being carried out. The investigation must be comprehensive enough to enable:
 - 2. A risk assessment to be undertaken relating to human health
 - A risk assessment to be undertaken relating to groundwater and surface waters associated on and off site that may be affected
 - 4. An appropriate gas risk assessment to be undertaken
 - 5. Refinement of the conceptual model
 - 6. The development of a method statement detailing the remediation requirements
- (b) The site investigation has been undertaken in accordance with details approved by the local planning authority and a risk assessment has been undertaken.
- (c) A method statement detailing the remediation requirements, including measures to minimise the impact on ground and surface waters using the information obtained from the site investigation, has been submitted to the local planning authority. The method statement shall include details of how the remediation works will be validated upon completion and shall be approved in writing by the local planning authority prior to the remediation being carried out on the site.
- 2. All development of the site shall accord with the approved method statement.
- 3. If during development, contamination not previously identified, is found to be present at the site then no further development shall take place (unless otherwise agreed in writing with the local planning authority for an addendum to the method statement). This addendum to the method statement must detail how this unsuspected

contamination shall be deal with.

4. Upon completion of the remediation detailed in the method statement a report shall be submitted to the local planning authority that provides verification that the required works regarding contamination have been carried out in accordance with the approved method statement. Post remediation sampling and monitoring results shall be included in the report to demonstrate that the required remediation has been fully met. Future monitoring proposals and reporting shall also be detailed in the report.

REASON: To safeguard health, safety and the environment in accordance with Policies DP3 & DP9 of the Warwick District Local Plan 1996-2011;

(16) the development (including any works of demolition) shall proceed only in strict accordance with a construction method statement which has been submitted to and approved in writing by the local planning authority. The approved statement shall be strictly adhered to throughout the construction period and shall provide for: the parking of vehicles of site operatives and visitors; the loading and unloading of plant and materials; the storage of plant and materials used in constructing the development; the erection and maintenance of a security hoarding including decorative displays and facilities for public viewing where appropriate; wheel washing facilities and other measures to ensure that any vehicle, plant or equipment leaving the application site does not carry mud or deposit other materials onto the public highway; measures to control the emission of dust and dirt during construction; and a scheme for recycling / disposing of waste resulting from demolition and construction works, unless otherwise agreed in writing by the local planning authority. **REASON:** In the interests of highway safety and the amenities of the occupiers of nearby properties, the free flow of traffic and the visual amenities of the locality in accordance with Policies DP2, DP6, DP8 & DP9 of the Warwick District Local Plan 1996-2011;

- (17) no development shall take place within the application site, unless and until a programme of archaeological works and investigations has been secured and initiated in accordance with a written scheme of investigation which has been submitted to and approved in writing by the local planning authority. Should anything of archaeological significance be found no development shall take place unless and until an appropriate scheme for mitigation and conservation has been submitted to and approved by the local planning authority. Details shall be carried out as approved'. **REASON:** In order to ensure any remains of archaeological importance, which help to increase our understanding of the Districts historical development are recorded, preserved and protected were applicable, before development commences in accordance with Policy DP4 of the Warwick District Local Plan 1996-2011;
- (18) no development shall take place under any reserved matters consent until a scheme for that reserved matters consent has been submitted to and approved in writing by the local planning authority demonstrating that surface water runoff does not exceed runoff from the undeveloped site and does not increase the risk of flooding off-site. Post development runoff volumes and peak flow rates will be limited to the Greenfield discharge rate for all rainfall return periods up to and including the 100 year plus 30% (for climate change) as outlined within the Flood Risk Assessment. On-Site surface water attenuation will be provided to the 1:100 Climate change (30%) standard using Sustainable Urban Drainage Systems. The site drainage strategy will demonstrate the appropriate assessment and adoption of SUDS techniques. The approved systems shall thereafter be retained and shall be managed and maintained in strict accordance with the approved details. REASON: To ensure that a satisfactory means of drainage is provided such as to minimise flooding, which promotes and maintains the good stewardship of the natural and built environment in accordance with Policies DP11 & DP3 of the Warwick District Local Plan 1996-2011;
- (19) the development hereby permitted shall be carried out in strict accordance with the details

- of surface and foul water drainage works that have been submitted to and approved in writing by the local planning authority. **REASON:** To ensure that adequate drainage facilities are available for the satisfactory and proper development of the site in accordance with Policy DP11 of the Warwick District Local Plan 1996-2011;
- (20) any landscaping (other than the planting of trees and shrubs) approved including boundary treatment, paving and footpaths referred to in condition one shall be completed in all respects for that phase of development, with the exception of tree(s) and shrub(s) planting, within the first planting season following the first use of the dwellings within that phase and the tree(s) and shrub(s) shall be planted within six months of that first use. Any tree(s) or shrub(s) removed, dying, or becoming in the opinion of the local planning authority seriously damaged, defective or diseased within five years from the substantial completion of the scheme shall be replaced within the next planting season by tree(s) or shrub(s) of similar size and species to those originally required to be planted. All hedging, tree(s) and shrub(s) shall be planted in accordance with British Standard BS4043 - Transplanting Rootballed Trees and BS4428 - Code of Practice for General Landscape Operations. REASON: To ensure a satisfactory standard of appearance of the development in the interests of the visual amenities of the area in accordance with Policies DP1, DP2 and DP3 of the Warwick District Local Plan 1996-2011;
- (21) the existing tree(s) and shrub(s) indicated on the approved plans to be retained shall not be cut down, grubbed out, topped, lopped or uprooted without the written consent of the local planning authority. Any tree(s) or shrub(s) removed without such consent or dying, or being severely damaged or diseased or becomes, in the opinion of the local planning authority, seriously damaged or defective, within five years from the substantial completion of development shall be replaced, as soon as practicable with tree(s) and shrub(s) of such size and species details of which must be submitted to and approved by the local planning authority. All tree(s) and shrub(s) shall be planted in accordance with British Standard BS4043 - Transplanting Root-

balled Trees and BS4428 – Code of Practice for General Landscape Operations (excluding hard surfaces). **REASON:** To protect those landscape features which are of significant amenity value and which ensure a satisfactory standard of appearance of the development in the interests of the visual amenities of the area in accordance with Policies DP1 and DP3 of the Warwick District Local Plan 1996-2011;

- (22) the mix of type and size of market dwellings submitted as part of any reserved matters application must accord with the recommendations contained within the most up to date version of the "Development Management Policy Guidance: Achieving Mix of Market Housing on new Development Sites".

 REASON: To ensure that the housing meets the needs of the District as required by Local Plan Policy SC1 and the NPPF; and
- (23) the building heights shall not exceed those indicated on the indicative plan Figure 23:
 Building Heights within the July 2013 Design and Access Statement submitted on 22nd August 2013. **REASON**: For the avoidance of doubt and to secure a satisfactory form of development in accordance with Policies DP1 and DP2 of the Warwick District Local Plan 1996-2011.
