6.01 Terms of Reference-

The Council will have 4 Overview and Scrutiny committees (Scrutiny Committees) - Environment, Economic, Social, Audit and Resources. The scope of activity for each of these is set out in the table below

6.02 General role

Within their terms of reference, overview and scrutiny committees will:

- review and/or scrutinise decisions made or actions taken in connection with the discharge of any of the Council=s functions;
- ii) make reports and/or recommendations to the full Council and/or the executive and/or any policy, joint or area committee in connection with the discharge of any functions;
- iii) consider any matter affecting the area or its inhabitants; and
- iv) exercise the right to call-in, for reconsideration, decisions made but not yet implemented by the executive and/or any policy or area committees.
- (v) agree the terms of reference of best value reviews

6.03 Specific functions

(a) Policy development and review.

Overview and scrutiny committees may:

- i) assist the Council and the executive in the development of its budget and policy framework by in-depth analysis of policy issues;
- ii) conduct research, community and other consultation in the analysis of policy issues and possible options;
- iii) consider and implement mechanisms to encourage and enhance community participation in the development of policy options;
- iv) question members of the executive and/or committees and chief officers about their views on issues and proposals affecting the area; and
- v) liaise with other external organisations operating in the area, whether national, regional or local, to ensure that the interests of local people are enhanced by collaborative working.

(b) Scrutiny

Overview and scrutiny committees may:

- review and scrutinise the decisions made by and performance of the executive and/or committees and council officers both in relation to individual decisions and over time:
- ii) review and scrutinise the performance of the Council in relation to its policy objectives, performance targets and/or particular service areas;

- question members of the executive and/or committees and chief officers about their decisions and performance of their services, whether generally in comparison with service plans and targets over a period of time, or in relation to particular decisions, initiatives or projects;
- iv) make recommendations to the executive and/or appropriate committee and/or Council arising from the outcome of the scrutiny process;
- v) best value: carry out fundamental reviews of Council services in conjunction with the Executive
- vi) review and scrutinise the performance of other public bodies in the area and invite reports from them by requesting them to address the overview and scrutiny committee and local people about their activities and performance; and
- vii) question and gather evidence from any person (with their consent).

(c) Finance

Overview and scrutiny committees may exercise overall responsibility for the finances made available to them (if any).

(d) Annual report

Overview and scrutiny committees must report annually to full Council on their workings and make recommendations for future work programmes and amended working methods if appropriate.

6.04 Proceedings of overview and scrutiny committees

Overview and scrutiny committees will conduct their proceedings in accordance with the Overview and Scrutiny Procedure Rules and the Council procedure rules (in part) as set out in Part 4 of this Constitution.

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
