Consultation & Community Engagement

This report is a request to approve the Consultation Strategy for the Tach Brook Country park and take the options for a masterplan to public consultation.

The options for the masterplan will be based on the results of a 'high level' on-line survey that will be under taken in November/December 2019 to identify the features the public would like to see within the new Country Park.

The principle of a Country Park was the subject of consultation through the Local Plan process.

Officers have met with Bishops' Tachbrook Parish Council to discuss the project and share information; and in 2018 Officers joined the Parish Council at two Neighbourhood Plan consultation events in the village and at Heathcote School, to share that information with the public and receive feedback.

approval and approval to submit a planning application (if required).

1. Summary

- 1.1 The Warwick District Local Plan 2011-2029 was adopted in September 2017 that includes a policy and land allocation for a Country Park (Policy DS13).
- 1.2 This report provides Members with the proposed approach for engaging with stakeholders and the public in the design and development of a masterplan for Tach Brook Country Park ('the Country Park').

2. **Recommendation**

- 2.1 That Executive agrees the Consultation Strategy set out in (Appendix 1).
- 2.2 That Executive note that the online survey is already live on the Council's website.
- 2.3 That Executive notes that following the public consultation a masterplan for the Country Park will be produced and brought before them for approval; and for approval to submit a planning application (if required).
- 2.4 That Executive note that consideration has been given to the potential impact on the consultation should additional land become available to create a larger country park.

3. **Reasons for the Recommendation**

Recommendation 2.1

- 3.1 Policy DS13 of the Local Plan identifies land for a Country Park between the southern edge of new development sites off Harbury Lane and Bishops' Tachbrook. The Country Park will address identified deficiencies in access to the countryside and natural green space in the area; and act as a green buffer to prevent further urban encroachment; provide for a range of recreational activities; and improve the ecological value of the area.
- 3.2 In 2014 the Executive agreed to acquiring the land for the Country Park and in November 2017 Executive approved the procurement of a Design Team to develop the concept and design of the County Park.
- 3.3 In 2019, Wood Environment and Infrastructure Solutions UK Limited ('Wood') was commissioned to deliver a detailed masterplan for the County Park and Appendix 1 sets out their approach for engaging with stakeholders and

residents. The detailed design will be for agreed Country Park land north of the Tach Book. Recommendation 2.2

3.4 The use of online surveys is standard practice when carrying out large scale public consultations, and it was considered prudent to progress this element of the project whilst seeking approval for the overall Consultation Strategy.

Recommendation 2.3

3.5 The masterplan will be brought back to the Executive for approval and for approval to submit a planning application (if necessary) to construct the Country Park. This would involve the procurement of a works contract to deliver the Country Park.

Recommendation 2.4

- 3.6 Wood have further been commissioned to investigate what additional features and functions stakeholders and the public would like to see if additional land, south of the Tach Brook, is secured in the future.
- 3.7 This work can be informed by the Consultation Strategy set out in Appendix 1, and will not require a separate consultation process.

4. **Policy Framework**

4.1 Fit for the Future (FFF)

The Council's FFF Strategy is designed to deliver the Vision for the District of making it a Great Place to Live, Work and Visit. To that end amongst other things the FFF Strategy contains several Key projects. This report shows the way forward for implementing a significant part of one of the Council's Key projects.

5. Budgetary Framework

5.1 The budgetary requirements for this work was agreed by Executive at its meeting in November 2014. The underlying principle is that the County Park will be delivered through funding contributions secured from section 106 agreements associated with the housing developments north of the County Park. The planned funding to be received within the Council's Infrastructure Delivery Plan for the project is $\pounds 2.857m$. This is to cover the capital costs and a commuted sum for the subsequent management and maintenance of the site.

5.2 The delivery of the Consultation Strategy and resulting masterplan will be met by funds from s106 agreements.

6. Risks

6.1 There are no specific risks related to taking the options for a Country Park masterplan out to public consultation. However, it is possible that the consultation may raise public expectations as to what may be possible to be delivered with the limited available financial resources.

7. Alternative Option(s) considered

- 7.1 An alternative option would be to proceed without additional engagement. This would risk the Council adopting a masterplan for the Country Park that has a negative impact on relationships with residents and the delivery of a park that does not met the needs of future users.
- 7.2 An alternative option would be to reduce the engagement period. However, this would entail a risk that residents feel excluded from a key Council decision.
- 7.3 An alternative option would be to consider the possible extension to the country park as a separate consultative exercise and separate masterplan. This could cause unnecessary work and confusion with stakeholders.
