This Action Plan which forms the service delivery plan for the Health Improvement Service on behalf of Stratford on Avon and Warwick District Councils has been prepared in line with the key priorities contained within the Joint Health Policy:-

- Tackle Social Exclusion and Inequalities
- Reduce Death Rate from Coronary Heart Disease & Stroke and Related Diseases (including Cancer)
   (with particular emphasis on supporting smoking cessation programmes, including 1000 new smoking cessation attempts per year in each of the partner districts)
- Reduce the Death Rate and Serious Injury Rate from Accidents
- Reduce the Death Rate from Suicide and Undetermined Injury

The actions/activities contained within this Action Plan actively support national, regional and local, plans, strategies and frameworks in relation to Health Improvement and Well Being.

It is important to realise however that this Action Plan is a working document which will inevitably require refinement as resources are allocated and priorities emerge. In particular it is designed to be flexible enough to accommodate the key issues which will emerge from the forthcoming White Paper 'Choosing Health' and any themes identified at local level. This plan does not sit in isolation as a number of actions identified in individual service plans also make a contribution towards achieving the same objectives.
