Item no.	4	Title	Fees and Charges 2013/14	Requested by	Labour Group
Reason considered	There were questions about the setting of charges, particularly in relation to Parking Services.				
Scrutiny Comment	The Committee reinforced its previous comments in respect of point 13.1.2 of the report and recommended that residents should receive a concession on the crematorium fees and charges.				
Executive Response	The Leader proposed that the reductions in fees be considered as part of the budget setting process and asked that the Section 151 Officer brought forward details in his December report of the impact on the Council's finances should a £25 concession be granted to local residents for Cremations and removal of the surcharge for former residents in respect of cemeteries. This was accepted by the Executive.

Reason considered	There were questions about the Council's support for community facilities.				
Scrutiny Comment	The Committee had no comments or recommendations to make to the Executive in respect of this report.

Item no.	7	Title	Outcome of Warwick District Council's Peer Challenge	Requested by	Labour Group
Reason considered	This had been an important exercise; there were questions about the report and how some issues raised would be addressed.				
Scrutiny Comment	<p>The Committee was concerned that the proposals in the Action Plan were insufficiently robust to tackle silo working.</p> <p>The Committee would like to see how the Council can develop community forums and clarify their role. It felt that the report did not fully reflect the range of issues relating to community forums and that the Action Plan should include a review of their role, including an assessment of the outcome of the WCC review of their effectiveness.</p> <p>The Committee recommended that the Executive include any necessary</p>				

	proposals to address the highlighted concerns in respect of the capacity to deliver the FFF programme within the Action Plan. If it is not an issue, then there should be a statement saying this.
Executive Response	<p>The Leader thanked the Committee for its comments and explained that there were no capacity issues at present but if councillors became aware of any issues they should report these to senior management.</p> <p>With regard to the community forums it was noted that Warwickshire County Council was currently reviewing community forums and therefore it was probably not the best time to consider the Council's position on these but councillors should share good practice to ensure that the forums in the district could be as effective as possible.</p> <p>The Leader informed the Executive that work was underway to demonstrate the cross portfolio work that was constantly undertaken within the Council and while this was going to be a complicated document it would provide a valuable amount of detail for all.</p>

Reason considered		<p>The Labour Group requested this item as the effectiveness of the Committee is clearly significant for the District; members had other issues to add.</p> <p>The Liberal Democrat Group felt it was discussing the foundation of a significant change.</p>			
Scrutiny Comment		<p>In respect of point 3.6 of the report, the Overview and Scrutiny Committee would ask Executive to satisfy itself that the arrangements to engage with external stakeholders are sufficiently robust to inform the review.</p> <p>The Committee requested that the Executive should satisfy itself that the Planning Committee is sufficiently involved in the Peer Review.</p> <p>Appendix 1 – Attitudes and Behaviours, point 3 The Overview and Scrutiny Committee recommended that the wording in this point changed to: "What is the cause of the divergence of views between officers and members?"</p>			
Executive Response		<p>The Leader accepted the meaning and intention of the recommendation from Overview and Scrutiny Committee but proposed that this was not included at this stage and instead this response be considered by officers as part of the review.</p>
