1. **Summary**

- 1.1 The Warwick District Local Plan 2011 2029, adopted in September 2017, contains commitments to bring forward Supplementary Planning Documents on a number of matters, including Custom and Self-Build.
- 1.2 The draft version of the Custom and Self-Build SPD was subject to a period of public consultation between 28 January and 11 March 2019. This report sets out the outcome of the consultation and recommends adoption of the final draft of the SPD.

2. Recommendation

- 2.1 That the Executive notes the statement of community consultation (Appendix 1) and approves the adoption of the SPD (Appendix 2).
- 2.2 The Executive notes that the adopted Custom and Self-Build SPD will be used in the determination of planning applications.

3. Reasons for the Recommendation

- 3.1 Under policy H15 of the Local Plan, the council has committed to produce an SPD to assist in the delivery of Custom and Self-Build dwellings.
- 3.2 The government has placed a duty upon Local Authorities to grant suitable development permission in respect of enough serviced plots of land to match demand on their self-build register.
- 3.3 The SPD will explain the approach that the Council will take to considering whether sites are suitable and provide more clarity in understanding the government's statements in support of self-build, the publicity for the register, new regulations and requirements placed upon LPAs.
- 3.4 The SPD went through an appropriate public consultation period, the representations to which are summarised and responded to in Appendix 1. As a result of the representations no amendments have been made to the consultation draft, the final draft attached as Appendix 2.

4. Policy Framework

4.1 Fit for the Future (FFF)

The Council's FFF Strategy is designed to deliver the Vision for the District of making it a Great Place to Live, Work and Visit. To that end amongst other things the FFF Strategy contains several Key projects.

The FFF Strategy has 3 strands – People, Services and Money and each has an external and internal element to it. The table below illustrates the impact of this proposal if any in relation to the Council's FFF Strategy.

The SCI specifically seeks to ensure that all relevant sectors of the community are consulted. The Local Plan has been subject to an equalities impact assessment which assessed the implications of consultations on equalities.

5.1 The costs of conducting the consultations and reviewing the responses were covered within the existing budget framework.

6. Risks

6.1 There are no specific risks related to adopting the SPD.

7. Alternative Option(s) considered

7.1 The Executive could decide not to adopt the Custom and Self-Build SPD, however this will take away the opportunity to emphasise the regulations set out by the Government and could lead to difficulty in managing expectations from the self-build community. It would also be contrary to a commitment within the Local Plan.

8. Background

- 8.1 The SPD consultation ran from 28 January to 11 March 2019, and received 4 representations.
- 8.2 As a result of the recent public consultation, there were no amendments to the document that were felt necessary.
