### Applicant: ST CHAD'S CENTRE TRUST COMPANY LTD (St Chad's)

**Description of scheme:** The project has two objectives; 1) To construct a pathway connecting from the village green to the

two main access points of the St Chad's Centre, including re-ordered drainage and a pathway timer operated lighting system, to provide all-weather all-year round safe access, and 2) To provide mains power supply to the village green from the centre to enable additional events and activities to be held

on the green.

Evidence of need: The need is visually obvious; the existing access to the centre is uneven, over broken ground, which

when wet is muddy and slippery and in the winter months the lack of lighting makes access difficult for the elderly and people with disabilities, this creates health and safety concerns which the project will resolve. The power supply to the village green has been requested by the community groups who

use the green for events, for example; the WI, Brownies and the local school.

This all helps to increase opportunities for everyone to enjoy and participate in sports/physical, arts and cultural activities.

#### Engaging and strengthening communities

The Centre is meeting an important need in the community; the new well-lit pathway to the village green will enable these facilities to be better connected, the use of toilets, kitchens, tables and chairs from the centre will also better support events on the green. The project will also deliver a power supply to the village green which will create further activities for the community to enjoy as it will enable additional events to be delivered. Events and activities bring people and families together which helps to engage and strengthen the community.
