Reduce Anti-Social Behaviour Increase Opportunities for		The Parish Council believe that anti-social behaviour is caused by a serious lack of sports facilities which lead to boredom, it is hoped that the new development of the tennis courts will help with the problem of bored and frustrated children. The project will appeal to a wider demographic of young people due to the increased range of sporting activities that can be played and will be more inclusive because it will provide for a mix of team and individual activities. This project will enable young people to feel valued and included in Village life. Census data shows that there are 108 young people aged 12-19 living in Bubbenhall and currently there is no provision for this age group on the playing fields. A petition with 80 names was sent to the Parish Council asking for a project to provide the 12-19 year old age group with some facilities.
