### 1. **SUMMARY**

1.1 Under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003 a premises may apply to vary their existing premises licence.

### 2. **RECOMMENDATION**

2.1 Members are asked to consider the information contained in this report, and decide whether the application for a variation of the premises licence for The Lazy Cow by Urban and Country Leisure (Warwick) LLP should be approved, and, if so, whether it should be subject to any conditions.

## 3. REASONS FOR THE RECOMMENDATION

- 3.1 Montchai Karmakharm applied to convert the existing Justices Licence for The Globe Hotel (Now called Lazy Cow) in July 2005 to a premises licence issued under the Licensing Act 2003 (LA 2003). Only the police could object to this conversion on the grounds of crime and disorder. No such objection was received so a licence was granted to commence on 24<sup>th</sup> November 2005. The current premises licence reflects the hours and conditions converted at the time.
- 3.2 The premises licence was transferred in August 2010 to the current owners. A minor variation was submitted at the same time to permit new plans to be added to the premises licence to show a refurbishment. This minor variation was granted under delegated authority by the Licences Services Manager.
- 3.3 Urban and Country Leisure (Warwick) LLP has now applied to vary the premises licence as follows

**Note:** This variation application does not seek to change the existing provision of alcohol and late night refreshments to residents and their bone fide guests 24 hours a day, seven days a week; or the existing permission to sell alcohol on New Year's Eve from the end of hours until the end on hours on New Year's day.

3.5 An operating schedule which will form part of any varied licence issued has been supplied as follows:

The Prevention of Crime and Disorder

The DPS or nominated relevant person will actively participate in the Local Pubwatch scheme, if any.

The premises will install and maintain a CCTV system covering the public bars/restaurant on the ground floor and the external garden/terrace area to the reasonable satisfaction of Warwickshire Police. The CCTV system must be working and recording at all times when the premises are open and conducting Licensable activity. The recordings must be kept for a period of 28 days. CCTV images must be made available upon request to any Responsible Authority.

#### The Prevention of Public Nuisance

- 1. Noise limiters will be fitted to regulate music levels at the premises and all reasonable advice from the Environmental Health Officer of Warwick District Council in relation to the limiters will be complied with.
- 2. Secondary glazing will be fitted to the 1st floor function room windows to increase their sound attenuation from music being played within the function room.
- 3. Any external speakers will either be deactivated or removed and no external speakers will be permitted to be used for Regulated Entertainment authorised by the premises licence, unless authorised to do so by a temporary event notice or any other lawful mechanism.
- 4. All internal speakers will be orientated to ensure that they do not directly face the wall located on the Theatre Street side of the premises.
- 5. No drinks will be allowed in the external area of the premises after 23.00 hours on any day. Notices will be clearly displayed within the external area informing customers of the licensing condition.
- 6. The premises will operate a curfew policy to non-residents to stop entry into the premises after 23:00 hours on any day. The premises must display a notice at all entry points informing customers of this policy.
- 7. Hotel residents will be asked to use the internal entryway into the bar area after 23:00 hours.
- 8. Prominent, clear and legible notices must be displayed at all exits requesting the public to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly.
- 9. Refuse such as bottles must be placed into receptacles outside the premises at times that will minimise the disturbance to any nearby properties.
- 3.6 Representations have been received from Environmental Health (Appendix 1), Warwickshire Police (Appendix 2) and an interested parties (Appendices 3 8)
- 3.7 A maps of the area of the premises are shown as Appendix 9
- 3.8 When considering the application the panel must give appropriate weight to:
  - a) The representations received.
  - b) Statutory guidance issued by the Secretary of State under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003.
  - c) The Council's Licensing Policy Statement (Appendix 10)
  - d) The Licensing Objectives, which are:
    - i) The Prevention of Crime and Disorder.
    - ii) Public Safety.
    - iii) The Prevention of Public Nuisance.

- iv) The Protection of Children from Harm.
- However, it should only consider those licensing objectives which have been referred to in the representations received.
- 3.9 The Council's Licensing Policy Statement provides that the authority will take an objective view on all applications and will seek to attach appropriate and proportionate conditions to licences where necessary in order to ensure compliance with the four licensing objectives shown earlier. Each application will be judged on its own individual merits.
- 3.10 Details of the procedure adopted by the Licensing Committee for Panel Hearings has been supplied to the applicant and those making representations. The procedure will be explained more fully by one of the Council's Legal Team at the commencement of the hearing.
