Suggested next steps (if not final decision please set out below)					
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1. **SUMMARY**

- 1.1 For many years the council has raised sponsorship towards the cost of providing floral street displays in various parts of the District. These funds have been aimed at enhancing the quality of the District by providing floral street displays at a number of high profile roundabouts, in some borders adjacent to the highway and by the provision of hanging baskets, tubs and poles in town centres.
- 1.2 At the September O&S Committee meeting additional information was requested regarding the sponsorship income that was included in HA34 target for 07/08. This report highlights the sponsorship that Warwick District Council has received in support of providing floral street displays which are a component of the annual In Bloom Competition and should have been included in the HA34 figure which is now no longer reported.

2. **RECOMMENDATION**

- 2.1 That members of the committee note the contents of the report.
- 2.2 Support a review of the areas where floral planting currently takes place to establish where and how more cost effective and sustainable methods of planting could be introduced without detriment to the quality of the District.

3. REASONS FOR THE RECOMMENDATION

3.1 Changes in the economic climate are likely to impact on the advertising and sponsorship decisions of companies. As a result the sponsorship received by Warwick District Council towards floral street displays could be adversely affected in 2009 and 2010. It is vital therefore more cost effective methods of planting are developed to maintain the quality of the District.

4. ALTERNATIVE OPTION CONSIDERED

4.1 No alternative options were considered.

5. **BUDGETARY FRAMEWORK**

- 5.1 The income received by Warwick District Council in 08/09 from sponsorship towards Britain in Bloom is £21,875.
- 5.2 The cost of providing floral planting for floral street displays in 2008/09 is expected to be around £38,000. Given the increase in energy costs the cost of floral planting is likely to increase significantly over the next few years.
- 5.3 The level of financial support i.e. the difference between sponsorship received and the expenditure for floral planting has been around £16,000 a year for the last three years.

6. **POLICY FRAMEWORK**

- One of the key objectives of the Council is to deliver a sustainable and quality environment. Clearly the provision of floral planting and hanging baskets supports that quality environment. However the cost of providing floral planting in both monetary and environmental terms has to be considered.
- 6.2 Officers believe that a move to introduce more sustainable planting schemes should therefore be considered and a review of all the non park areas where floral planting takes place should be undertaken.

7. BACKGROUND

- 7.1.1 The main form of sponsorship which Warwick District Council has received has come from the sale of hanging baskets / tubs. Details of the sponsorship are set out in 7.2
- 7.2 The table showing sponsorship income received and expenditure on floral planting over the last three years from all sources is set out below.

- 7.3 An agreement between Immediate Solutions and Warwick District Council is currently in place regarding the sponsorship of roundabouts.
- 7.4 Negotiations are taking place between Warwick District Council and Warwickshire County Council; who as the Highway Authority are responsible for the roundabouts; regarding the wider development of this scheme.
- 7.5 A report is planned for the Executive in February regarding the development of the current agreement with Immediate Solutions.
- 7.6 A report is also planned for February to consider the introduction of more sustainable floral planting across the District
