Three amendments from the Labour Group to Recommendations on Page 7

1. Recommendation (b) to be amended to read

Limiting the number of dependent children used in the calculation of reduction to two **plus all** children born before April 2017.

Rationale – to bring this policy in line with the amended policy on Universal Credit recently announced by the Minister for Work and Pensions.

2. Recommendation (b) to be further amended to read

Limiting the number of dependent children used in the calculation of reduction to two plus [all children born before April 2017 and] all children living in larger families as a result of two carers from former family units forming a new or 'merged' family unit or as a result of guardianship arrangements

Rationale – to remove any disincentive for families to reform and for guardianship arrangements, often to support and safeguard children, to be put in place.

3. Recommendation (i) to be amended to read

Retaining the current capital cut-off limit at £16,000

Rationale: The proposed cut to £6000 with no tapering is out of line with Universal Credit and is severe. Councillors may not wish to discourage saving and in particular saving for a house deposit, so drastically. Universal Credit not only tapers the impact of this rule but also defers the application of the £16k upper limit for those migrating on from Benefits for a full 12 months. Councillors may wish to review revised proposals to reflect the UC approach
